Briggs & Turivas

At this site, Briggs & Turivas rebuilt, repaired or scrapped used railroad cars and equipment.

Opened in the 1920's, many different types of railroad equipment came and went from the B&T yard.

If a car could not be repaired, many of its parts would be removed and reused. The car would then be cut up for scrap, which was shipped to steel mills for recycling.

During the steam era, old or used locomotives would often be bought as scrap. Some were rebuilt and sold to other railroads that were in need of additional locomotive power.
